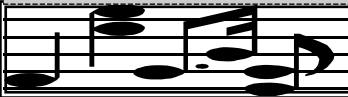

He also had his old 40ft wooden yacht, all bought and paid for. Within three weeks of completing this massive task, he was bored out of his tiny mind. He discovered that the farming life was not for him and ever since that time he has been happy just wheeling and dealing in antiques.

From the Isle of Arran to Edinburgh, to country Tasmania and then to Hobart, where he now has a shop in the suburb of New Town. In 2002, Peter Meakin, from channel 9, saw a pilot that Gordon's mate Charles Wooley had made with him and commissioned 8 half hour shows on the strength of it. Unfortunately, for all concerned Peter Meakin moved to channel 7 and Gordon was shifted to Ray Martin's Current Affair, where he was eventually on every Thursday night doing the Tartan Treasure Hunter, this lasted for about 18 months. Followed by, about a year long sabbatical, until the [television show Collectors](#), added Gordon to their team, to be their roving eye reporter and panel member, this successful prime time ABC show, is now in its fifth year of production.
